I am going to ask you, before you leave this morning, to make sure they have your correct mailing address, phone number, whatever information you wish to give to them, so they may properly be in compliance with the Criminal Procedure regarding any presentation to the Grand Jury.

MR. COLLINS: Yes.

THE COURT: This Court has now lost jurisdiction of this matter, and make sure I have your correct address, Mr. Collins, in case this matter is remanded back here for reconsideration.

MR. COLLINS: Yes.
