Enclosed is documentation on attorneys who are deliberately violating the Lawyers Code of Professional Conduct. The two attorneys that I would like to bring charges against are Nicholas D. Morsillo and Frank Putorti.

Nicholas Morsillo has deliberately filed false petitions, told witnesses not to show up to court, had clients perjure themselves, gotten others to perjure themselves, filed false briefs with the court and has deliberately lied to the court. Mr. Morsillo as you will see has worked in conjunction with the judges in this case.


I believe the evidence will show that Mr. Putorti was told by Mr. Morsillo not to represent me properly.

Since there are others involved who you do not have jurisdiction over I would appreciate it if you would turn this over to the State's Attorney General's office.
